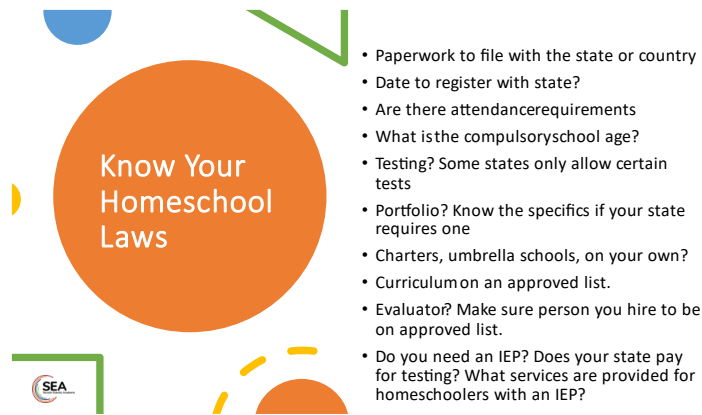


Welcome to the SEA Homeschooling Community

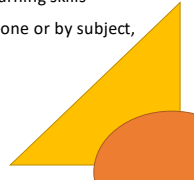

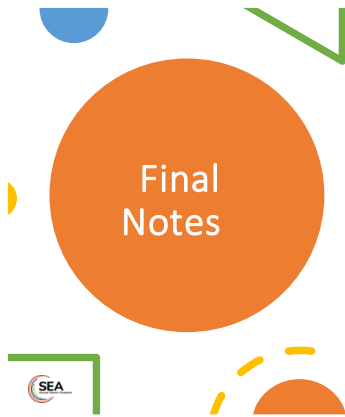

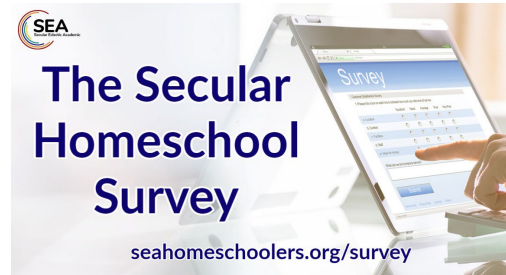
